Genesis chapter one and verse two, the earth was without form and void and darkness was on the face of the deep and the spirit of God was hovering over the face of the water.

Second verse. Second verse of the Bible. John went on to talk about the Holy Spirit's activity in the creation and Job did. Job said by his spirit he adorned the heavens. Genesis goes on and says God endows people with life with breath when it says that the Lord stooped down and breathed into his God breathed into man spirit. There was the spirit of the Lord imparting. And
